## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Virginia Teachers for Tomorrow II is a continuation of Virginia Teachers for Tomorrow I. This course extends the focus on historical and contemporary topics relevant to an understanding of the knowledge, skills, and dispositions required of classroom teachers. Students will have the opportunity to research and reflect on professional practices in PreK - 12 classroom settings. Students will take part in a year-long internship while developing a professional portfolio.
