Core English Grade 11
(LA1150)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Throughout the English 11 course, students focus on four areas: verbal and multimodal communication, reading analysis, writing development, and research. In the introductory unit, the focus is establishing the process for writing and the overarching idea for the year, “The American Dream.” The introductory unit is followed by the following units of study: *Resistance, The Power of Individual, and Reality of Life and Loss*. Continued attention is given to reading for inference, understanding different viewpoints, and recognizing literary techniques used by writers. In addition, the students extend their critical and analytical skills to arrive at logical conclusions. Writing, reading, discussion, performance-based assessments, and classroom presentations require students to move beyond literal recall of facts to an interpretation of literature with cooperative written response.

English 11 requires students to use the writing process to develop expository, narrative, reflective, and persuasive writing. The students write in a variety of forms with an emphasis on persuasion. Through writing instruction, students learn to analyze their own writing and set goals to improve their composing and expression, and grammar, usage, and mechanics. Students are provided opportunities to examine various purposes for writing and to consider how writers make choices based on audience, purpose, and format. The students continuously revise and edit their work as they build their writing. Additionally, they continue to read and write critically in response literature.

Students will take two Standards of Learning (SOL) Tests for English: Writing and Reading/Literature and Research or a substitute test approved by the State Board of Education. Specific dates for the spring and summer SOL test will be announced by the school.

Enrollment for the next English course should be based on student performance, teacher recommendation, and parent input. The courses available are English, Grade 12; Honors English, Grade 12; Dual Enrollment English 111, 112; and English, Grade 12, AP Literature and Composition.
