# **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Turf Management is a three-credit course designed to teach the duties and tasks of professionals who develop, establish, and maintain lawns in public areas such as golf courses, parks, athletic fields, school campuses and residential sites. Course objectives include the physiology and taxonomy of major turf grass species, designing turf grass areas and the safe use and maintenance of turf related equipment.
